Community Infrastructure Project 1:

Project name and location: 6 Speed Awareness Signs

Each Cornwall Divisional Member has received a large increase in the number of complaints regarding speeding traffic around Newquay. Cornwall Council are no longer providing funding for this type of signage. Therefore, the Cornwall Councilors are proposing 6 locations around Newquay to install a type of flashing Speed Awareness sign.

Locations:

It is proposed for a sign to be sited at each of the following locations:

Trenance – Treloggan Road

Trenance – Trevemper

Porth & Tretherras – Porth Way

Porth & Tretherras – William Hosking Road (outside Nansledan School)

Central & Pentire – Tower Road

Central & Pentire – Pentire Road
